If you are an expecting mother or caregiver in Tamil Nadu, PICME 3.0 is the official health department portal for pregnancy registration, health tracking, and obtaining your RCH ID required for maternity benefits and birth certificate processing.

PICME 3.0 - Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is PICME 3.0?

PICME 3.0 is the latest version of Tamil Nadu's Pregnancy and Infant Cohort Monitoring and Evaluation system.

2. How do I register for PICME 3.0 online?

Visit https://picme3.tn.gov.in/api/react2/, click "Pre-registration by Public", fill in your details, and submit.

3. What is an RCH ID and how long does it take to receive it?

The RCH ID is a 12-digit number issued after verification by a Village Health Nurse (VHN).

4. Is PICME 3.0 registration mandatory for getting a birth certificate?

Yes. It is required for birth registration in Tamil Nadu.

5. How to avail 70000 rupees maternity benefit?

Check eligibility under specific state and central government health schemes through PHC or the Tamil Nadu Health Department.

6. How to get 6000 rupees for pregnant ladies?

Under the Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY), pregnant women receive Rs. 6000 after registration via PICME.

7. What is the 50000 rupees scheme for girl child?

It refers to the Tamil Nadu Girl Child Protection Scheme, which provides fixed deposits for eligible girl children.

8. How to apply for a Thayi Card online?

After PICME registration and verification, your RCH ID is linked to your Thayi Card, available online.

9. Can I get money if I am pregnant?

Yes. Financial assistance is available under various maternity benefit schemes like PMMVY and Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy Scheme.

10. How to get an RCH number?

Register on the PICME portal or through your Village Health Nurse. The 12-digit RCH ID will be sent via SMS.

11. What is the amount of 18000 rupees pregnancy scheme in Tamil Nadu?

Under the Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy Maternity Benefit Scheme, women receive Rs. 18000 in five installments.
